Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology Major achievements Month of March, 2021

The significant developments pertaining to Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology for the month of March, 2021 are as given below:

I. Important Policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

1. Digital Payments

BHIM UPI has continued to show upward trend by recording over 273 crore transactions, with value of Rs.5.05 lakh crore, in the month of March 2021 which indicates the increasing acceptance of BHIM UPI as the preferred mode for making digital payment transactions.

2. International Cooperation

Second G20 Digital Economy Task Force (DETF) held on Virtual Mode

MeitY and MEA represented India in 'Second G20 Digital Economy Task Force (DETF)' meeting held on March 18-19, 2021 on virtual mode.

India's position was shared on various ICT issues including digital transformation in production for sustainable growth, measurement, practice and impact of the digital economy, connectivity and social inclusion, free flow of data with trust and cross-border data flows, leveraging trustworthy AI to include MSMEs, Consumer protection, Child protection, Smart cities, Block chain for traceability of products and services, Digital tools to maintain public service and business continuity, Digital identity and Agile regulation.

3. Electronics Manufacturing

Compulsory Registration Order, 2012 (CRO)

The Electronics & Information Technology Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration), Order, 2021 was notified on 18.03.2021 in the Gazette of India for migrating the existing Electronics & Information Technology Goods (Requirement of Compulsory Registration) Order, 2012 from BIS Act, 1986 to BIS Act, 2016.

The implementation date for products notified vide Gazette Notification dated 01.10.2020 under the Phase-V of Compulsory Registration Order, 2012 has been extended upto 01.10.2021 vide Gazette notification dated 12.03.2021.

4. National Informatics Centre

Aarogya Setu – Aarogya Setu is a mobile application launched to aid the COVID-19 efforts of the Government. The App augments the COVID-19 initiatives of the Government in proactively reaching out and informing the users of the app regarding risks, best practices and relevant advisories pertaining to the containment of COVID-19.

The application is based on contact tracing method and helps the Government in identifying, monitoring and mitigating the spread of COVID-19 across the country. More than 17.32 crore users have downloaded Aarogya Setu App till March, 2021.

5. UIDAI

UIDAI has been organizing a number of workshops regarding "Aadhaar Authentication and Offline Verification" explaining Online Authentication, Aadhaar Offline Verification, Aadhaar Paperless Offline e-KYC and Secure QR code and also give live demo of applications and services. During the month of March 2021, one workshop was conducted over Video Conference (VC) for various Central/State Government entities.

I. Important developments under MeitY's Schemes:

- As on 31st March, 2021 total number of Aadhaar generated are 128.99 crore against the 'projected population 2020' of 137.05 crore. The overall Aadhaar (Live) saturation across India stands at 90.97%.
